CENTERING

LIGHTING THE SECOND ADVENT CANDLE OF PEACE

We light our Advent wreath each week with these words from the prophet Isaiah (Isaiah 61:1-3). Jesus claimed these words as a guide for his ministry, and we can claim them, too. Today, our Advent candle lighting is led by the Arren family.

One: The spirit of the Lord God is upon me,

because the Lord has anointed me;

All: God has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed,

[Pause to light the first candle]

One: to bind up the brokenhearted,

to proclaim liberty to the captives

and release to the prisoners;

[Pause to light the second candle]

All: to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor

and the day of vindication of our God;

One: to comfort all who mourn;

to provide for those who mourn in Zion-

All: to give them a garland instead of ashes,

the oil of gladness instead of mourning,

the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit.

They will be called oaks of righteousness,

the planting of the Lord, to display God's glory.

One: We light these candles as a sign of our waiting

and hope for the coming Christ.

healing.

GOSPEL LESSON

Ezekiel 37:1-13

37 The hand of the Lord came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the Lord and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. 2 He led me all around them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry. 3 He said to me, "Mortal, can these bones live?" I answered, "O Lord God, you know." 4 Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the Lord. 5 Thus says the Lord God to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. 6 I will lay sinews on you and will cause flesh to come upon you and cover you with skin and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the Lord."

7 So I prophesied as I had been commanded, and as I prophesied, suddenly there was a noise, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. 8 I looked, and there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them, but there was no breath in them. 9 Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath, prophesy, mortal, and say to the breath: Thus says the Lord God: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe upon these slain, that they may live." 10 I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, a vast multitude.

11 Then he said to me, "Mortal, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They say, 'Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are cut off completely.' 12 Therefore prophesy and say to them: Thus says the Lord God: I am going to open your graves and bring you up from your graves, O my people, and I will bring you back to the land of Israel. 13 And you shall know that I am the Lord when I open your graves and bring you up from your graves, O my people. 14 I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you on your own soil; then you shall know that I, the Lord, have spoken and will act, says the Lord."
