

CALL TO WORSHIP

One: The Psalmist says, "this is the day the Lord has made,

let us rejoice and be glad in it!"

All: We will rejoice!

One: Like the songbirds before dawn,

like the crickets after sunset:

All: we will rejoice!

One: Like children running through a sprinkler,

like workers at the end of a long day,

All: we will rejoice!

One: Though the world is full of trouble,

it is fuller still of beauty, and delight,

and a love that is stronger than death, and so,

All: we will rejoice!

One: We worship a God of power and of everlasting love,

All: and we will rejoice!

CENTERING

PRAYER OF INVOCATION (Unison)

Spirit of the living God, fall afresh on us today. Soften our hardened hearts. Stir up our imaginations. Open us to see the delights scattered throughout this world: warm cups of coffee, cooling waves lapping at our ankles, blooming dahlias and hollyhocks. All: Forgive us, and reveal your presence in the chaos of our lives.

One: We have tried, and failed, to be perfect, believing that that is what You require.

All: Forgive us, and shower us with your grace that meets us right where we are.

One: In the silence, we lay down our shame, our regrets, our unfinished business, and we reach for your joy.
